## A call for reviving a shared European identity

During a recent meeting, held in Nicosia, the members of YUFE's Strategic Council expressed their concerns about ongoing political developments, noting a growing apathy towards Europe and opposition to the idea of a shared European identity and values.

To ensure that Europe remains competitive and independent in a globalised world, we cannot risk a European continent being fragmented into small imaginative parts not following the same set of principles.
